## **Immediate Report**

### **Loss of Amos 6**

Further to the Immediate Report published by the Company on March 19, 2013, concerning the convening of a Special General Meeting of the Company's shareholders, the amending report dated March 20, 2013, and the supplementary report dated April 29, 2013, regarding D.B.S. Satellite Services (1998) Ltd. ("DBS") entering into a transaction whereby, *inter alia*, it was agreed to lease space segments of satellite Amos 6, which was intended to replace the satellite Amos 2 which DBS was using at that time (together with an additional satellite, Amos 3), on September 1, 2016 Spacecom Ltd reported that to the best of its knowledge, during ground fueling of the launch rocket for the Amos 6 satellite, an explosion occurred on the launch rocket that caused the total loss of the satellite.

Broadcasts of DBS are continuing regularly, since they are carried out by satellites Amos 2 and Amos 3 (including the transfer of space segments from Amos 2 to Amos 3). It is possible that in the future, if a replacement is not found, it will be necessary to reduce a limited number of low-audience channels from DBS broadcasts. DBS is assessing, together with Spacecom, obtaining additional space segments beyond those guaranteed it in the event of the failure of the Amos 6 satellite, which would eliminate the need to reduce a limited number of channels as stated, and also the other implications arising from the loss.
